Arthur Ellis Award nomination

We had more wonderful news a few days ago. BURY YOUR DEAD has been shortlisted for the Arthur Ellis Award for Best Crime Novel. It's sponsored by the Crime Writers of Canada. Here's the complete list of nominees for Best Novel:


Michael Van Rooy for A Criminal to Remember; Louise Penny for Bury Your Dead; Mike Knowles for In Plain Sight; C.B Forrest for Slow Recoil; and Jeffrey Moore for The Extinction Club. Wonderful list, but bittersweet. Michael Van Rooy, a wonderful Winnipeg writer was on tour with his book this past winter, when he died. He was in Montreal, and apparently had a heart attack. He was 42 and left a wife and young children. It was and continues to be, a shock.

Congratulations to everyone nominated! The Ellis Awards will be in Victoria, British Columbia, June 2nd.

May Events

From here I travel to Pittsburgh, for the Festival of Mystery, in Oakmont on Monday afternoon and evening, May 2nd. It's at the Greek Orthodox Church, starting at five. The festival is organized by Richard and Mary Alice, at Mystery Lovers Bookshop. If you want to see the list of all the amazing writers who'll be there, just go to the store's website.

Then on Tuesday it's off to Bradford, a small town in northern Pennsylvania. They chose STILL LIFE as their One Book, One Community read this year, and I agreed to go and do a few events.

Along the same lines, it's been announced that STILL LIFE has been chosen by the entire province of Prince Edward Island to be the One Book, One Island selection. They're also doing the French version of the book, EN PLEIN COEUR.

And, BURY YOUR DEAD will be the One Book, One Community selection for Kitchener-Waterloo, in Ontario.

From Bradford I head home. To try to finish the first draft of the next book. Since I generally do five or six drafts, I'll still be far from finished. But the first draft is always the most difficult.





A show we've been hoping she'll finally get since we first met the Morrows back in STILL LIFE. But there are a few disturbing questions. Will Clara's art be embraced by a sophisticated and jaded art world? And if it is, how will her husband Peter react? An artist himself, he carries around both his gift of creation and his burden of jealousy.

But the biggest question is: Who is the body found in Clara's garden after the big opening night party? And who killed her?

Chief Inspector Gamache, of the Surete du Quebec, travels once again to this little village that, like Peter, like all the residents, is both blessed and blighted. It's a wonderful place to live, and an easy place to die.

As Gamache investigates he delves deeper and deeper into the murky world of art and artists. Where nothing is as it seems, where bright smiles hide dark thoughts, where rotten deeds are glossed over. Gamache soon realizes even the truth is a matter of perception, and might not be real at all but simply a trick of the light.

As I mentioned, the book will be launched in Canada and the US on August 30th.

Every morning Michael and I hold hands and do a short prayer and silent meditation. We hold you there and send out kind thoughts.




