But March also saw a very good friend diagnosed with end-stage leukemia. After three weeks in hospital Jim died - surrounded by friends.







Sandra Goldberg lecture on Palliative Care

Then, on flying back to Montreal, I'll be interviewing Will Schwalbe onstage. I was once quite active in Palliative Care in Quebec, as a ward volunteer then sitting on the McGill Council on Palliative Care. The head of the council is a personal friend - Kappy Flanders. Every year, to raise money and awareness, they hold the Sandra Goldberg lecture on Palliative Care and this year they invited Will Schwalbe to speak. When his mother was diagnosed with stage 4 pancreatic cancer, they passed the time during the chemo sessions talking about books. They shared a love of the written word. Eventually, mother and son realized they'd formed their own intimate, powerful book club.

After her death, Will wrote the most wonderful, funny, insightful,



thoughtful book about their experience. It's called, THE END OF YOUR LIFE BOOKCLUB. It's luminous.

Kappy asked if I'd interview him on stage, and I immediately said yes. One of the many, many, unexpected gifts of being a writer myself is getting to meet so many gifted writers. Like Peter Robinson. Like Will Schwalbe.

I am keenly aware of your support, of how you have championed the books and the characters. How you've told friends, and family and complete strangers about Chief Inspector Gamache - and the books that appear to be about death but are, in reality, about life.

As Will Schwalbe and his mother discovered - reading (and writing) is an act of creation, whether we have seventy more years or just hours left. It is about life. About eternity. Powerful, positive, creative.

Thank you, dear friend, for breathing life into Gamache and Clara, Gabri and Ruth. And for recognizing Three Pines as a haven for second chances. And that the books are more about the mystery of life, as they are about murder.
