
And, you can even pre-order the book. Here's the link.

I suspect you have the same voice, sometimes. Horrible, isn't it? Still, the price of daring.

HOW THE LIGHT GETS IN - nominations


And January had brought more wonderful news!

I can hardly wait for you to read the next journey for Armand et al. THE LONG WAY HOME.



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












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
