



Three Pines

Like those artists, readers ask, 'Where is Three Pines?' I tell them it's inspired by where Michael and I live in Quebec's Eastern Townships. It's a pastiche, a tribute, a thank you to a place that welcomed two strangers and gave us a home.

But, more than that, Three Pines exists in a way that is more powerful than any dot (or lack thereof) on a map.

Three Pines is a state of mind. When we choose to be kind instead of cutting, when we choose compassion over easy cruelty or cleverness, when we take that huge leap of faith and trust and choose to believe that goodness really does exist, starting within ourselves - then we're in Three Pines.

I do not, as friends will tell you, always live in Three Pines. But I know when I've wandered away.

Michael, on the other hand, does live permanently in the village. Not because he's a saint (and we all know what pains they can be), but because of his choices and character, and fate.

He has a seat in the bistro, by the fire. And I join him whenever I can.

Of course, the beauty of this is that we don't have to be in the same room, or home, or city or even country to be together in Three Pines. In the bistro, on the village green, on the bench above the village. In Clara's kitchen or Myrna's bookstore.

Three Pines is where brave souls meet. Noli timere. Be not afraid.

Thank you for giving Michael and me a time we will always cherish.
