I better win.


Actually, everyone is very nice and they make it clear they're here for the party, and the celebration (and, I suspect, to fawn over the other nominees! That's my plan too).

Bishop's University - Honourary Doctorate of Law


I won't actually be able to be there because that very weekend I'll be at Bishop's University, in Lennoxville, Quebec, receiving an Honourary Doctorate of Law.
